TASTING NOTES Floral attack, very subtle with orange blossom remiscences which come from the Torrontés. Notes to cherries and strawberries typical from the Malbec. Very Fresh. In mouth, refreshing entry, velvety and fruiy. Medium body which preserves freshness and fruitness. The final is fresh, elegant and the torrontes floral notes outstand in a subtle way.
